What Medications to Avoid Before & After Surgery

Section I.

The following drugs either contain aspirin and/or have undesirable side effects that may affect your surgery (abnormal bleeding and bruising). These drugs should be avoided for two weeks prior to surgery. This is not every medication known to cause problems, please inform us of any medications that you are currently taking. If you need to take something for relief of minor pain, you may take Tylenol.

Dietary Supplements and Their Hidden Dangers

Patients may fail to tell their doctors about supplements for a number of reasons. Many do not think of these products as medicine, and others are afraid of what their doctor may say to them.

A number of commonly used supplements can jeopardize your safety in surgery.

St. John's Wort, has a mild monoamine oxidase (MAO) inhibitory effect, and may intensify the effect of anesthesia. Stop taking <u>seven</u> days before surgery.

Yohimbe, (the "natural" Viagra[®]) and **licorice root**, also have MAO effects and increase the potency of the anesthetic.

Gingko biloba, a powerful anticoagulant is considered to be three times stronger than vitamin E. (causes bleeding). Stop taking it <u>two</u> days before surgery.

Ginger, **Garlic**, **Cayenne** and **Bilberry** have antiplatelet activity and may inhibit clot formation (can cause bleeding). Stop taking <u>seven</u> days before surgery.

Ginseng has been associated with episodes of high blood pressure and rapid heart rate. Stop taking <u>seven</u> days before surgery.

Fish oil can cause excessive bleeding. Stop taking <u>seven</u> days before surgery.

Melatonin decreases the amount of anesthesia needed for surgery.

Echinacea may impact the liver when general anesthetic is used. Stop taking it two days before surgery.

Kava calms nerver and encourages sleep. Stop taking two days before surgery.

Aloe, used topically, can cause contact dermatitis, and when ingested, can create low potassium levels.

PC-SPES, used for prostate cancer, may cause deep vein thrombophlebitis.

Some of the most popular brand-name vitamins are now promoting combination pills that include the usual vitamins as well as supplements for the reduction of stress, increasing energy, increasing memory and other specialized needs. In the past, herbals were found only in health food stores. Now they crowd the shelves of grocery stores, drug stores, and discount chains.

American consumers self-prescribe from an increasing array of OTC drugs. Some assume that because a substance is "natural," it is safe. What they fail to understand is that many plants contain strong chemicals, and some are actually poisonous.



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There are no established manufacturing standards for dietary supplements and these products are not required to obtain FDA approvals or to prove efficacy and safety. The purchaser cannot even be sure that an herbal potion contains what is described on the label.
